Beloved:

For each of the five (5) readings of *Beloved*, read and then write a QPA focusing on:

Characterization techniques, which include:

- o physical description
- o setting/physical environment
- o narration/point of view
- o narrative time
- o sentence structure
- o motif
- o naming
- o dialogue/interior monologue
- o plot action/incident
- o cultural and historical allusions

For each paragraph, you should avoid focusing on more than one of these so find your center—find a focus. Authors will employ most of these techniques—and we have the opportunity to experience Morrison's art, so let the text be your guide. Pay careful attention to her craft. In doing so, I think we can gain a greater appreciation for Morrison as a writer and historical narrative. Also, work to hone your sentence writing, which includes varying sentence structures, using active verbs/avoiding passive voice, and reducing wordiness.
